## Terms of the Sale

1. The minimum bid accepted for a lot is the starting bid. Wherever possible, the auctioneer's estimated market value (EMV) or actual current market value from dealers' pricelists or other sources (CMV) is included in the lot description as a guideline for bidders.
2. The highest (successful) bid will be placed at one bidding increment over the second-place bid. Bidding increments are: $\$ 0.50$ to $\$ 5=\$ 0.50, \$ 5$ to $\$ 25=\$ 1, \$ 25$ to $\$ 50=\$ 2, \$ 50$ to $\$ 100=\$ 3$, and $>\$ 100=\$ 5$. All nonconforming bids will be rounded down to the proper bid increment. Bids are in U.S. currency. In instances of tied high bids, the lot sells to the earliest bidder. The winning bid will be one bidding increment over the secondplace bid regardless of the amount bid.
3. E-mail bids (rcichorz@comcast.net) are preferred, but telephone (303-494-8361) or mail bids (3925 Longwood Ave., Boulder, CO 80305-7233) are acceptable. Mail bids need to arrive at the auctioneer's Boulder home address on or before the date of the auction's closing and the auctioneer is not responsible for late mail delivery. Bid sheets should include your SCC membership number to confirm eligibility to participate and your name and mailing address. E-mail bids will be confirmed by e-mail reply. Telephone bids will be notated and confirmed by the auctioneer at the time they are placed. Mail bids will not be confirmed unless bidder includes a telephone number or e-mail address. By placing a bid, you acknowledge that you agree to be bound by the terms and conditions of the sale.
4. Successful bidders will be informed of their winning bids shortly after the close of the auction. Invoices will be included with the dispatched auction lots. Postage (and insurance, if applicable) will be added to the price of the successful bid(s). Payment can be made in U.S. funds by check (to the "SCC Library"), USPS postal money order, bank draft, or in currency (at sender's risk, auctioneer suggests certified or insured mail). Sorry, credit-card payments are not accepted, although payments via PayPal can be arranged (inquire with the auctioneer).
5. Lots may be returned for a refund if grossly misdescribed. Lots consisting of multiple non-book items are only approximately described, so slight inaccuracies in the item counts and description of the lots are not cause for return. Books, catalogues, and periodicals are generally used library copies in serviceable condition, unless otherwise noted in the lot descriptions.
6. Prices realized for lots are distributed to bidders via e-mail soon after the auction closing and published on the SCC Website. If applicable, unsold lots are noted at the end of the prices realized list and are available at their respective starting bids on a first-come, first-served basis.

2. Denmark: Takstfortegnelse / Rate List, in Danish, by Knud Tolbøl, AFA-Forlaget, Aarhus, Denmark, 1983, 32 pages, illustrated, $53 / 4 " \times 81 / 4 "$ paperback, ISBN 87-7012-113-3, pristine. Although in Danish, its rate tables and otherwise tabular text presentation make it somewhat user-friendly for the English-only reader, includes illustrations of covers with stamp uses to meet existing rates from 1851 onwards. Superseded by subsequent editions, but this one is useful for all domestic \& foreign pre-1983 postal rates. EMV $=\$ 10$, Starting bid $=\$ 2$.

The most complete and comprehensive Danish postal stationery reference to date that lists and prices (albeit dated) all official and printed-to-private-order issues. $\mathrm{CMV}=\$ 30$, Starting bid $=\$ 10$.

Finland / Periodical: The Finnish Philatelist, the quarterly newsletter of the Finnish Study Group of the SCC, edited and published by Roger Quinby, nine different issues from Vol. 2, No. 1 (April 1997) to Vol. 13, No. 3 (August 2008), $81 / 2 " \times 11$ " staple bound, profusely illustrated (three in color starting with issue \#40). Issues vary from 8 to 32 pages each (19 pages average) and contain a wide range of articles on all aspects of Finnish stamps and postal history, a treasure trove of research reports. EMV $=\$ 36$, Starting bid $=\$ 7$.

Authorized English translation of text from Handbok over Norges Frimerker, Volume 1, 1855-1858 about the typographed Coat-of-Arms stamps, includes useful information on the production and relative scarcity/rarity of color varieties and multiples (pairs, strips, and blocks). Informative souvenir booklet from PFA celebrating the 125 Anniversary of the first Swedish stamp, with an accompanying PFA special souvenir Post Kort that illustrates the 1855 tre skilling banco. Sweden / Stamp Yearbook: Svenska Frimärken Berättar, Årsbok 93/94 / Swedish Stamps Storytelling, Yearbook 93/94, trilingual in Swedish, English, and German, PFA Swedish Post, Stockholm, 1990, 42 pages, profusely illustrated entirely in color, blue-cover hardbound, pristine. Official yearbook for Swedish mint stamps, booklet panes, and souvenir sheets, the mounts are intact herein but the stamps were removed, so this book can be used to increase retail value of the year pack for 1993 by $\$ 15$ by placing the 1993 year pack stamps in it, or $\$ 75$ if you also place the sports black-print in the mount space opposite the title page. Classic reference with priced (albeit dated) catalogue listings and detailed explanations - the completely revised edition of Hurt and Williams' Priced Catalogue of Local Postage Stamps - contains extensive listings for all the world's locals, including Denmark, Finland, Norway, and Sweden. CMV $=\$ 40$, Starting bid $=\$ 16$.

This edition greatly expands from the first two editions' coverage of OAT ("Onward Air Transmission") and AV2 ("Avion 2" = UPU term for arrival at destination) cachets used from 1938 to 1974. Various types of OAT markings appear on airmail covers to Sweden and the Type XIII OAT marking appears on some Iceland and Faroes covers, all of which are highly coveted by postal historians and airmail cover collectors. geography, history, literature, language, religion, education, industrial development, WWI and its after effects, includes an extensive index. CMV $=\$ 32.50$, Starting Bid $=\$ 6$.

Grimley, Johan Grundt Tanum, Oslo, 1939, 176 pages +2 maps +30 photograph pages, $61 / 4 " \times 9$ " hardbound, fair condition (front cover with minor binding separation). Enlarged, revised, and reprinted version of the 1937 First Edition by Griff-Forlaget, Oslo, this book consists of 14 chapter on the country, the people, agriculture \& forestry, fisheries, shipping, industries, capital \& labor, producers' cooperation, consumers' cooperation, pioneer cooperatives, social cooperation, public finances \& ownership, education, and symbols of the new Norway. Rothery's perspectives of Norway and Spitzbergen, based on her travels through the country, presented in three parts, includes a brief chronological outline of Norwegian History and extensive bibliography and index. General Moulton's historical perspective of the Norwegian campaign of 1940 and account of how British sea power and Norwegian defenses failed to save Norway from the German invasion and occupation, includes two appendices and extensive bibliography and index. An interesting illustrated anthology of thousands of brief snippets about noteworthy people and events that occurred in Norway before and during the reign of King Haakon VII's (19051957) reign up to 1945 . $\mathrm{CMV}=\$ 60$, Starting bid $=\$ 4$.
19. Fridtjof Nansen, by Marit Greve, Aschehoug \& Co., Oslo, 1994, 56 pages, illustrated, 6 " x $81 / 4 "$ hardbound, ISBN 82-03-22-76-2, pristine. Biography of Nansen (1861-1930), Norwegian polymath and Nobel Peace Prize laureate who gained prominence at various points in his life as an explorer, scientist, diplomat, and humanitarian, perhaps best known for leading the team that made the first crossing of the Greenland interior in 1888, traversing the island on cross-country skis. Folklore Fights the Nazis, Humor in Occupied Norway, 1940-1945, by Kathleen Stokker, The University of Wisconsin Press, Madison, WI, 1997, iv + 273, 70 pages, illustrated, 6" x 9" softbound, ISBN 0-299-15444-0, like-new condition. Consisting of 12 chapters, extensive chapter notes, bibliography, and index, this book concludes that Norwegians - traditionally regarded as serious-minded folks - employed a sly sense of humor at the expense of their Nazi invaders despite a 1942 German ordinance mandating death for the ridicule of Nazi soldiers! $\mathrm{CMV}=\$ 20$, Starting Bid $=\$ 5$.

Somewhat dated (pre-PC-era) guidelines for the specialist concerned with research and problems confronting the student of philately or postal history, but two opening chapters are important for a brief history of philatelic research from the 1860s, when the first journals for stamp collectors were published, through the 1960s with the appearance of specialist societies' publications containing major research works. English translation of the 1989 Second Edition of Brun's Faux et Truqués on the production of forgeries, and although most illustrations are of French material, the information here is applicable to all forgeries - this work is the methodology of detecting a fake and not a line-by-line guide for specific fakes - and consists of four major sections on counterfeit stamps, altered stamps, falsified documents, and counterfeits \& counterfeiters. Pricing disparity noted as Hartmann @ $\$ 70$ and Bansner @ $\$ 20$. EMV $=\$ 45$, Starting bid $=\$ 15$.

Befeler's inaugural mystery novel about an octogenarian with severe short-term memory who is accused of stealing a valuable Swiss stamp collection and murdering the owner in their retirement home. Essential authoritative handbook for collectors and bibliophiles with an interest in Tasmanian philately and postal history. CMV $=\$ 85$, Starting bid $=\$ 20$.
27. Canada / Postal History: The Stamps \& Postal History of Vancouver Island \& British Columbia Formed by Gerald E. Wellburn Collection, Danial L. Eaton and Jack Wallace (Editors), F. E. Beautifully produced deluxe volume with two-to-a-page color illustrations of the handwritten $71 / 2 " \times 53 / 4 "$ pages of the pioneer postage stamps and postal history collection of Vancouver Island and British Columbia spanning the years 1849-1878 assembled by Wellburn, essential "handbook information" herein for collectors interested in this area of Canadian postal history. The book is arranged in chapters by the 13 airlines that issued the semi-official airmail stamps for their services and is an essential history of these airlines and catalogue of their stamps. 29. China: An Airline at War, Pan Am's China National Aviation Corporation and Its Men, by Robert L. Willett, Author-published, Lexington, KY, 2008, 360 pages, illustrated, 6 " x 9 " softbound, ISBN 1-4392-0082-3, like-new condition. Nonphilatelic, compelling story of the pilots and their crews who went to China to fly for China National Aviation Corporation in the 1930s \& 1940s, when wartime chaos prevailed in the country and airplanes and airlines were in their infancy. Essential priced (albeit dated) specialized catalogue of Cuban philately with sections on postal history, postage stamps (includes die varieties, printing errors, and contemporary postmarks \& cancels), postal rates, semi-postals, franchise markings, telegraph stamps, postal stationery, aerograms, official closure labels, first-flight covers, and more. (Note that in spite of two subsequent editions, current price for this Third Edition from two on-line sellers averages $\$ 80$.) EMV $=\$ 60$, Starting bid $=\$ 15$.

Hall's Polish Locals, this specialized priced catalogue lists and illustrates alphabetically by place names stamp and postal stationery issues of the Polish municipal posts, Germania overprints \& Austrian area (postmaster provisionals), and Russia \& Ukraine area, includes a forgeries guide. CMV $=\$ 20$, Starting bid $=\$ 5$.

Trepel, Confederate Stamp Alliance, 2008 First Edition, vii +282 pages, profusely illustrated in color, $83 / 4$ " x 111/4" hardbound, ISBN 978-0-9818893-0-6, pristine. Contains ten chapters, seven appendices, and an extensive bibliography, and is a most-welcomed update of Lawrence Shefield's The Special Postal Routes, the long-standing postal history reference on this subject.
