## Terms of the Sale

1. The minimum bid accepted for a lot is the starting bid. Wherever possible, the auctioneer's estimated market value (EMV) or actual current market value from dealers' pricelists or other sources (CMV) is included in the lot description as a guideline for bidders.
2. The highest (successful) bid will be placed at one bidding increment over the second-place bid. Bidding increments are: $\$ 0.50$ to $\$ 5=\$ 0.50, \$ 5$ to $\$ 25=\$ 1, \$ 25$ to $\$ 50=\$ 2, \$ 50$ to $\$ 100=\$ 3$, and $>\$ 100=\$ 5$. All nonconforming bids will be rounded down to the proper bid increment. Bids are in U.S. currency. In instances of tied high bids, the lot sells to the earliest bidder. The winning bid will be one bidding increment over the second-place bid regardless of the amount bid.
3. E-mail bids (rcichorz@comcast.net) are preferred, but telephone (303-494-8361) or mail bids (3925 Longwood Ave., Boulder, CO 80305-7233) are acceptable. Mail bids need to arrive at the auctioneer's Boulder home address on or before the date of the auction's closing, and the auctioneer is not responsible for late mail delivery. Bid sheets should include your SCC membership number to confirm eligibility to participate and your name and mailing address. E-mail bids will be confirmed by e-mail reply. Telephone bids will be notated and confirmed by the auctioneer at the time they are placed. Mail bids will not be confirmed unless bidder includes a telephone number or e-mail address. By placing a bid, you acknowledge that you agree to be bound by the terms and conditions of the sale.
4. Successful bidders will be informed of their winning bids shortly after the close of the auction. Invoices will be included with the dispatched auction lots. Postage (and insurance, if applicable) will be added to the price of the successful bid(s). Payment can be made in U.S. funds by check (to the "SCC Library"), USPS postal money order, bank draft, or in currency (at sender's risk, auctioneer suggests certified or insured mail). Sorry, creditcard payments are not accepted, although payments via PayPal can be arranged (inquire with the auctioneer).
5. Lots may be returned for a refund if grossly misdescribed. The opening five lots are the first five issues (all in like-new condition) of Fakes Forgeries Experts (FFE), a series of twenty 9 " $\times 113 / 4$ " softbound periodicals comprising anthologies of articles written by experts on all manner of fakes and forgeries of stamps and covers that also include modern postal counterfeits intended to defraud postal administrations. Color-illustrated Nordic-related articles in these issues are cited in the lot descriptions. For further information about these articles, their synopses appear in Roger Cichorz's "From the Stacks" column in The Posthorn 4/2023. FFE Volumes 1-5 are presently available from the Facit Stamps / Postiljonen AB website listed at $€ 53.50 / \sim \$ 58$ each (postpaid). Philatelic Bibliopole's (Leonard Hartmann's) retail prices for Nos. 1-5 are $\$ 90$ to $\$ 100$ per volume, but not all volumes are for single sale. SCCL also has Volumes 6-11 on hand and these will be offered in the next SCCL auction \#73 scheduled for July 2024.

Both volumes have priced (albeit dated) listings of the numeral cancels identified by city and valued individually for strikes on 1851-1875 stamps, and the star cancels are listed alphabetically by place name and valued as both the "with star" and "starless types" - the 1980 catalogue adds a new section by Eitner on the bridge-type circular datestamps of letter-collecting offices listed alphabetically by place name along with their dates of use. The current market values (CMVs) cited are the current retail list prices of Nordfrim (a stamp company in Otterup, Denmark) that are substantially lower than the retail list prices of U.S. dealers and the Scott valuations; consequently, the starting bids are set high, at $\sim 75 \%$ of Nordfrim's CMVs - but they range from only 24 to $52 \%$ of the Scott valuations.

Norway / Cinderellas: selection of nearly 200 cinderella stamps from Norway, primarily Christmas seal issues from Norsk Folkehjelp, Den Norske Sjømannsmisjon, Norske Kvinners Sanitetsforening, Norges Röda Kors, and several religious organizations, as well as a few stamps from other charitable organizations, with half the stamps being 1952-1956 Red Cross issues - blocks of 16 each for the single-design $1953 \& 1954$ issues, booklet panes of 20 for the 1952 single-design stamps \& 1956 for 20 stamps, 20 designs issues, and all 20 designs of the 1955 issue (from broken sheets), evaluation of this eclectic collection is difficult, but individual stamps when available at on-line auctions are $\sim \$ 1$ or more each, but let's start at a low $\sim 15$ cents each. EMV = 225 , Starting bid $=\$ 5$.

Sweden: smörgåsbord lot of 13 event and commemorative postcards, comprising five maxi-cards (1983 UN Swedish flag issue + four STOCKHOLMIA 86), three unused and two unused pictorial postal cards with indicia. Sweden / Cinderellas: phenomenal accumulacloser 700 to 800 mostly different cinderella stamps and seals on $284.5 " \mathrm{x} 7$ " stock cards, the bulk of which are issues from a variety of charitable organizations, but there is also a good selection of the På Post för Sverige (patriotic stamps of the 1940s) and some items produced by Swedish philatelic clubs; donor indicates this lot does not include any annual Christmas tuberculosis seals and that the majority of these are reasonably common and sell for a few cents each when offered in small groups, but a number of items herein command higher prices, worth a closer examination. EMV $=\$ 150$, Starting bid $=\$ 50$.

Ephemera / Worldwide: a nostalgic trip down memory lane to Nassau Street with 18 more Zenith Stamp Company's $\sim 71 / 2 " \times 31 / 2 "$ approval sheets torn (thus, ragged left sides) from approval booklets containing offers of hinged "sets" (most incomplete, low denominations) of 1933-1956 foreign stamps ranging from Australia to Yugoslavia and priced at $10 \notin$ to $40 \notin$ each, sheets have a total of 93 different stamps ( 77 unused $\& 16$ used) from 18 different countries, originally priced at $\$ 4.30$, and, as expected, these cheap approval stamps are of little value today (Scott @ $\$ 56.90$ if all were mint NH), and only two premium sheets are present (1941 Jordan \& 1955 Singapore partial sets @ $\$ 22$ versus their original price of 70 cents). Note that a list of stamps with Scott $\# s$ and values can be provided on request. EMV $=\$ 18$, Starting bid $=\$ 3$.
82. Ephemera / Color Guide: Gebrüder Senfs Farbentafel für Briefmarkensammler / Color Chart for Stamp Collectors, Verlag von Gebrüder Senfs in Leipzig, circa 1940, $93 / 4$ " x $81 / 4$ " cardstock sheet printed on both sides
and folded in half vertically. An unusual color guide using actual stamps to indicate colors whose inner section is divided into 40 spaces with printed color names and affixed worldwide (primarily pre-1940 European) stamps representative of those color designations. An Internet search found only one offered from a European seller at $€ 13.39 / \sim \$ 14.76$. $\mathrm{CMV}=\$ 15$, Starting bid $=\$ 8$.

The descriptions of the following five lots (\#s 83-87) of Cinderella stamps and seals are by the SCC member donor, and the number of items only roughly checked by the auctioneer. Consequently, the actual numbers of items in these lots may vary (high or low) from counts given in the descriptions. These lots are not returnable in accordance with SCCL Auction Term \#5, which states that lots consisting of multiple non-book items are only approximately described, so slight inaccuracies in the item counts and description of the lots are not cause for return.
83. Ajman / Cinderellas: ~200 mint and CTO fantasies and $\sim 45$ stamps listed by Scott @ $\sim \$ 17$ from Ajman, one of the seven emirates in the former Trucial States that form today's United Arab Emirates, good range of topical subjects. EMV $=\$ 125$, Starting bid $=\$ 25$.
84.: Batum / Cinderellas: 451993 CTO pictorial stamps (some duplicates), fantasies without recognized postal validity from Batum, a city on the Black Sea in the southwest corner of Georgia, birds and mushrooms topicals. EMV $=\$ 22$, Starting bid $=\$ 4$.
85. Dubai / Cinderellas: $\sim 50 \mathrm{mint}$ and CTO stamps and two souvenir sheets comprising $\sim 20$ items listed by Scott @ $\sim \$ 23$ as legitimate postal issues and $\sim 30$ fantasies not listed with these non-Scott items offered on e-Bay and other websites ranging from of a few cents to a few dollars each. EMV $=\$ 25$, Starting bid $=\$ 5$.
86. Fujeira / Cinderellas: 200+ items from Fujeira, one of the seven emirates in the former Trucial States that form today's United Arab Emirates, $\sim 19$ of which are listed by Scott as legitimate postal issues, but a larger number ( $\sim 190$ mint and CTOs) of fantasies got no closer to the Middle East than New York City, good range of topical subjects. EMV $=\$ 100$, Starting bid $=\$ 20$.
87. Manama / Cinderellas: collection of several hundred mint and CTO fantasy stamps from this tiny oasis village with $\sim 5000$ population, now part of the United Arab Emirates, items offered on e-Bay and other websites ranging from a few cents to a few dollars each, good range of topical subjects. EMV $=\$ 100$, Starting bid $=\$ 20$.
88. Europe / Cinderellas: eclectic lot of 19 Cinderella labels and poster stamps in a cardstock 10-page stock book, comprising 12 German items, Italian 1908 triangular Earthquake Relief Fund cinderella, vintage (circa 1940-1950) Swissair luggage label, large poster stamp for Schreiner International Air Training of the Netherlands, and four Michelin Tire Man self-adhesive labels, lot difficult to value but individual Cinderellas like these are typically offered for $\$ 1$ to $\$ 2$ each on e-Bay and other internet sell sites, but nine of the Swissair labels averaged $\$ 6+$ each on eBay (three others from delusional sellers averaged $\$ 40$ each!). EMV $=\$ 24$, Starting bid $=\$ 5$.
89. Estonia / Postal Stationery: $641988-1994$ postally used $61 / 4 " \times 4 "$ postal stationery envelopes, comprising eight Soviet frankings and 56 with Eesti Post cds, 21 without printed cachets (three registered) and 43 with printed cachets (six registered and others with additional postal markings), wide range of topicals including Christmas, outdoor scenes, planes, ships, cats, fish, flora, people, statues, buildings, etc., difficult assemblage, a potential one-frame exhibit here of Soviet-era Estonia leading into its independence from the USSR. EMV = $\$ 200$, Starting bid $=\$ 40$.
90. Estonia: 15 used 1980-2001~6" x 4" pictorial postcards, includes two Soviet use, three Navire, five with pictorial postmarks, and two costume maxi-cards, frankings of 27 stamps @ ECV $\$ 15$ for off-cover postally used stamps. EMV $=\$ 15$, Starting bid $=\$ 3$.
91. Estonia: $1191990-2001$ primarily $73 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 2 "$ and seven larger-sized Eesti Post cacheted first day covers primarily to the U.S., single and multiple stamp frankings with a wide range of 246 definitive and commemorative stamps and two $\mathrm{s} / \mathrm{s} / @ \mathrm{ECV} \$ 175$ for off-cover postally used stamps, duplication although most with different numbers and arrangements of stamps. EMV $=\$ 120$, Starting bid $=\$ 24$.

Great Britain / Prephilatelic Covers: five small (size range $\sim 31 / 4 " \times 23 / 4$ " to $43 / 4 " \times 31 / 4$ ") folded letters deserving further study, comprising $\bullet$ June 29, 1723 one-page folded letter with no postal markings from Seton to Haddington with contents from a surgeon stating the infirm condition of a potential traveler, $\bullet$ March 13, 1750 two-page folded letter from Scotland with contents and manuscript postage payment notation on front, $\bullet$ April 22, 1758 one-page folded letter from North Berwick to Haddington with contents, but no postal markings, - November 13, 1773 cover page only (no contents) from Montrose, Scotland to London, with manuscript payment on front and straight-line "MONTROSE," red Scots Bishops mark "NO/17," and wax seal on back, • 1838 cover page only (no contents) to Orkney with straight-line "STRANRAER/ NY PO" on front and wax seal on back. These covers were priced at $£ 34 / \sim \$ 63$ when the donor purchased them circa 1978 . EMV $=\$ 125$, Starting bid $=\$ 25$.

Jersey, Channel Islands / Prephilatelic Cover: 1839 folded $43 / 4 " \times 31 / 4 "$ two-page letter from Charles Blampied in Jersey to Peter Le Brun in Jersey Harbor, Newfoundland, with no postal markings, manuscript endorsed Jersey 19 October 1839 with message in French. Cover is in fair condition, completely intact except for wax seal removal when ripped open, but has major stain marks inside; nevertheless, a scarce early Jersey trans-Atlantic mailing with a premium for non-European destination.
